





















Exam Supports





Generally students use technology in exams instead of personal support e.g.


- Reading software instead of readers
- Typing instead of scribes
- Marking guidelines instead of a spelling and grammar waiver

Extra time can also be allocated Some students will have access to a smaller exam room

Students need to request exam supports from their lecturers /the Exams staff in their campus well in advance of each exam if needed. Follow the instructions you get by email.

All students need to apply if you wish to get DSS supports – but it's your choice! DARE reduced students must apply for supports. Even you were not eligible for DARE you can still get supports. CIT DSS operates a strict confidentiality policy and we cannot disclose any information about the student registration, academic progress, to parents, lecturers, etc., unless we have the student's consent, or unless there is a health and safety risk.

How to apply for supports? 3 STEPS!

 STEP 1: Fill out Online Application Form: www.mycit.ie/access_disability/disability-support-service/registering

STEP 2: Submit documents by email
 (DSS already has copies of documents from CAO/DARE).

- Attend classes and sign up to DSS Canvas module.
- STEP 3: Receive a needs assessment which confirms DSS supports / reasonable accommodations.
- This is sent to your myCIT email. You may be waiting a few weeks to receive it. You may also be asked to attend a meeting with DSS staff.

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Your Needs assessment / supports



- Your needs assessment document is yours – you decide what to do with it.
- It's your responsibility to engage with supports recommended in your needs assessment.
- You can request to review your supports at any time when you are in CIT.



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
