Your Degree in Business Information Systems...What Next?

What skills have I gained from my Business Information Systems (BIS) degree?

A degree in BIS will establish a strong foundation for understanding technology, commercial enterprise and business ethics, as well as providing the ability to partake in key business functions. A Business Management degree will particularly develop your strategic-thinking and decision-making skills.

Core skills gained from a BIS degree include:

Other key characteristics required for employment in BIS roles:

- Numeracy
- Business Foresight & Initiative
- Presentation Skills
- Self-development skills to keep up-to-date with fast-changing trends and their role in a commercial environment.
- Professional approach to time, costs and deadlines.

Note: It is vital that you recognise and differentiate between your technical skills and your non-technical or 'soft' skills in preparation for pursuing employment or further study.

What can I do with my BIS degree?

Graduating from a BIS degree leaves you with a diverse range of opportunities to consider. Ideally you will spend a lot of your final year carefully researching your options for **graduate employment** or **further study.**

Professional Accounting Qualifications

BIS graduates have the option of training for a professional accounting qualification. A business degree is not a necessity if you want to complete professional accountancy or tax exams, but it is an advantage particularly as many organisations now require their employees to have a degree and to possess strong commercial awareness.

You may choose to train for any of the following qualifications;

- Accounting Technician
- Tax Advisor/Consultant
- Professional Financial or Management Accountant

Employment Sectors

As Business Management graduates have the opportunity to work across all industry sectors in business related functions, the sectors below are some of the key areas for job-hunting and career development. For each of these sectors a Business Management graduate would often enter the industry within the management spectrum in a junior role.

Banking & Insurance

Business Management graduates may choose to work in the Banking or Insurance sectors, which also include Regulation & Compliance, and Risk Management.

Banking can be categorised into; Investment Banking, Corporate Banking, Private Banking and Retail Banking. Professional exams can be taken as part of your role in banking and depending on that role, there are specific qualifications available. The Institute of Bankers in Ireland is the professional education body for bankers and financial services practitioners in Ireland. Insurance can be categorised into; Underwriting, Claims, Sales and Actuary. Professional exams can be taken as part of your role in insurance and depending on that role, there are specific qualifications available. Consultancy

Consultancy involves offering expert advice to organisations about people management, key internal projects or strategic commercial plans. Consultants can operate at any level or in any section of an organisation, for example IT Consultants in the IT department or Management Consultants with the CEO or Directors of the organisation.

Fast Moving Consumer Goods

Fast moving consumer goods (FMCG) implies any product that has a high turnover and sells in large volumes. Many of the products in retail or commercial outlets, such as high street clothes shops, pubs or supermarkets come from FMCG companies.

Public Service

Public service encompasses the civil service, local and national government, and semi-state organisations that address areas such as agriculture & food, health, education, finance, defense, transport and communication, among others. Logistics & Supply Chain

Logistics and supply chain involves the movement and distribution of products at all stages of production within an organisation as well as externally to reach the end consumer. Organisations can have an internal logistics and supply chain department or choose to use a contractor in this sector.

Software Applications Developers/IT Analysts:

The installation and integration of Smart Technology and Information Systems in businesses 'and organisations spanning every spectrum is on the increase.

Jobs span, managerial, professional and technician levels, with a significant majority in;

Software development (Java, C++, C#, VB, Ruby, Perl, Python)

Network and security experts (.net, SharePoint, encryption, cloud computing, virtualisation (VMware))

System administrators (Oracle, J2EE, SQL Server)

Web developers (PHP, JavaScript, XML, HTML, Flex, ColdFusion)

Business analysts & IT project managers.

The demand for IT skills span a variety of sectors, from ICT (HP Ireland, Avaya, Quest Software, EMC, Allevo) to gaming (PopCap Games), on-line gambling(Paddy Power) and energy (e.g. Endeco Technologies), with the financial sector featuring prominently as an employer of IT skills (Fidelity Investments, Monex, Fidessa, Murex).

Finding Employment

Employers seeking final year/postgraduate BIS students or recent graduates generally advertise their roles as either *Graduate Jobs* or *Graduate Programmes*.

Some large companies offer Graduate Programmes which normally range in duration from 18 months to 2 years. This may involve just one role or a rotation of roles in the same department or different departments to learn about the organisation and to see where your interests and skills lie. Graduates will usually receive formal training or mentoring as part of their role.

In most cases companies are offering a full-time permanent role to a graduate as part of the programme. Competition for places is tough as large numbers of students apply for a small number of places with organisations. Many organisations recruit between October and December so final year students need to be on the lookout as soon as the academic year starts. Recent graduates can often apply too but check with the organisation first

Gaining a postgraduate qualification brings with it many benefits. It enables you to gain further, more specialized knowledge in your field of study. It can give you a specific technical, vocational or professional qualification and facilitate you in developing a range of key skills including; research, analysis, evaluation and written communication.

A Business Management degree qualification also gives you the opportunity to train as a secondary school teacher in accounting, economics or business. The Postgraduate Diploma in Education (PGDE), formerly known as the Higher Diploma in Education, can be completed through the four NUI Colleges or through a number of other colleges in Ireland.
