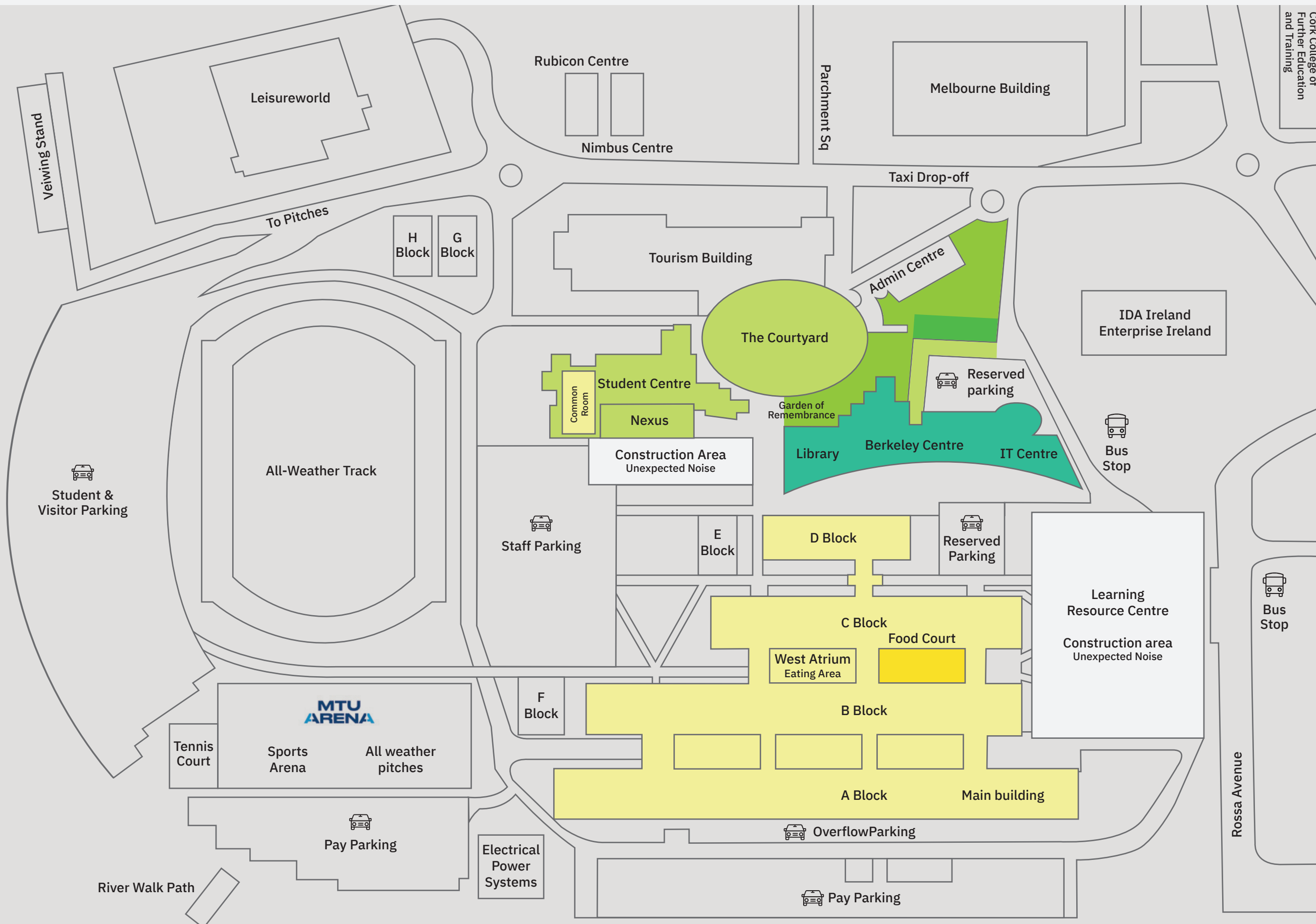


Noise to expect on the MTU Bishopstown campus

Unexpected Noise

Sounds to expect on the MTU Bishopstown campus



Voices - speaking, chatter, laughter in both indoor and outdoor areas.



Moving furniture - scraping sounds on tiles in the food court and eating areas.



Humming sounds from fridges, kitchen lights in food service areas.



Mobile phone sounds, rings, beeping and conversations indoors and outdoors.



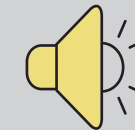
Common Room (student centre) sounds, pool balls making clicking noise from pool tables, laughter and talking.



Car sounds from roads and car parking areas - cars starting and engines running, car horns, bus engines.



Nature sounds, rustling leaves and birds.



Regular Sounds

Expect extra sounds & noise when classes end and begin (usually at the start and end of each hour) – speaking, laughing, footfall, phones, doors opening and closing.



Extra / Unexpected sounds

At times throughout the semesters there will be unexpected sounds.

For example, noises from events like RAG week, graduation ceremonies, society events, and building and gardening works.
