





EDTECH @ MTU

MTU provides a state of the art digital learning ecosystem that is supported locally across our Cork campuses. The Department of Technology Enhanced Learning (TEL) manage this digital learning ecosystem and offer a range of related supports to students on the use of these systems. At the heart of our ecosustem is a modern Learning Management System (LMS) called "Canvas" and an integrated video conferencing platform called "Zoom". TEL and EDSU also manage and provide a number of other online learning components, including a plagiarism detection systes, attendance tools, and an e-portfolio systems which you may come across as part of your studies.

Canvas

Canvas is a modern user-friendly Learning
Management System which is integrated with the
university's student record system, meaning that
every module is automatically given its own space
on the platform, with student access being provided
to these spaces based on the most up-to-date
enrollment data. Canvas allows you as a student to
access course materials, complete assignments and
other assessments, access grades and feedback and
communicate with your lecturers and fellow students.
Canvas can be used on your desktop or laptop or by
using the Canvas App on your smartphone or tablet.
The Canvas App lets you keep track of course work
and get up-to-date information on your modules and
activities through push notifications.

Zoom

Zoom, where used, will allow you to participate in live online classes and other live learning events. The Zoom system is fully integrated into the Canvas Learning Management System, meaning you can access Zoom from inside Canvas itself. If Zoom recordings are made, these will also be accessible from inside Canvas. Zoom provides a wide range of features to support your learning including video conferencing, breakout sessions, desktop sharing, chat, and polling. There is also a Zoom app available for Android and iOS.

Plagiarism Detection

Plagiarism detection systems use text-matching and writing style analysis to assess the originality of submitted texts. Like Zoom, these system are integrated into Canvas and, if used by your lecturer, will appear as an added feature to any Canvas assignment submissions they ask you to make. In some cases, lecturers may also provide you with plagiarism analysis reports to help you to learn more about how academic writing and referencing works.

Students will be notified in advance of any restrictions or late fees.



MTU Medical Centre Bishopstown

The Medical Centre is situated on the Bishopstown Campus. It is available to all registered full-time MTU students including those in the MTU Cork School of Music, the MTU Crawford College of Art and Design and the National Maritime College of Ireland. We are open to students during term time and provide a comprehensive range of services suitable for student's needs.

What the Bishopstown Medical Centre provides:

- Medical attention to all registered full-time students.
- Appointments with Doctors and Nurses can be arranged by phone only. Please do not present to the Medical Centre without an appointment.
- Specialist clinics including Asthma, Sexual Health, Sports Injury and Vaccination.
- A fee of €10.00 applies for all Doctor consultations including Telephone consultations. Payment can be made by your student card. The Student Health Centre is not a medical card practice. Local students with medical cards are advised to visit their own GP to ensure continuity of care. Non-Local students with medical cards may avail of the service but are also advised to register with a local GMS GP. Nurse consultations are free.
- STI testing is available to all students free of charge.
- Contraception is available free of charge to 17 26 year olds inclusive.

COUNSELLING



During your time at MTU, you may experience personal and emotional issues that impact on your college experience. The Student Counselling Service is here to support you to manage and overcome these issues and make the most of your time at MTU. It is a confidential service available to all full time MTU students at no cost. It is staffed by professional counsellors who are experienced in working with students in a safe, non-judgmental and supportive way.

The Student Counselling service offers a range of supports for students including:

Silvercloud Digital Mental Health Programmes

Silvercloud is a digital mental health platform which is available to all students free of charge. Students can access eight self-help programmes completely confidentially, or access a range of additional supported programmes through a counsellor.

• Koru Mindfulness Course

Koru is the only evidence-based mindfulness curriculum designed for college-aged adults. Students learn practical skills that help them manage stress and open their minds. The course runs online and in-person one class a week for four weeks for four weeks and bookings can be made by contacting student counselling via email.

• One-to-one Counselling

Counselling is offered on a one-to-one basis. An initial session will be arranged for you to meet a counsellor and decide the best way forward for you. If counselling is deemed suitable, then the service provides six sessions. Towards the end of these six sessions, you and your counsellor will review and, if necessary, discuss further possible options.
