



Student Contribution Charge: €3,000. This is an annual charge set by the Government for all full-time third level students. Students can apply to Student Universal Support Ireland (SUSI) for a grant. For information on Grants go to www.susi.ie

The USI membership levy has been introduced as a result of a referendum where students opted to affiliate to the national Students Union. This Levy is not covered by a SUSI grant and must be paid before September 12th 2016.

SUSI Grant Applicants

Students who have applied for a SUSI grant should bring their grant application reference number to the Accounts Office in September and complete an instalment application form. You will be required to pay your

Payment Options

Option 1: Full Payment €3,000 + €7.00 USI Levy & Tuition (if applicable) prior to commencement of Semester 1 (12th September 2016).

Option 2: First Instalment €1,500 + €7 USI Levy & (50% Tuition if applicable) before 12th September 2016

fees in monthly instalments which are refundable should your SUSI grant application be successful.

Payment of Fees

- Students are notified of their fees by e-mail to their CIT student e-mail account, therefore it is important that students check their e-mail accounts regularly
- To make payments, students should logon to the online payments facility www.cit.ie/pay. You will need your student ID number (R000XXXXX), Date of birth and your Debit/Credit card details
- A receipt will be sent to your CIT e-mail account once the payment is made. You may also query your account balance from this link
