EDTECH @ MTU CORK

The Department of Technology Enhanced Learning (TEL) in MTU Cork has a mission to create new learning opportunities and to enrich the learning experience of all students by providing a worldclass online learning ecosystem. At the heart of this ecosystem is a modern Learning Management System (LMS) or Virtual Learning Environment (VLE) called "Canvas" and an integrated video conferencing platform called "Zoom". The TEL Department also manages and provides a number of other online learning components, including a plagiarism detection system called "Ouriginal", which you may come across as part of your studies.

Canvas

Canvas is a modern user-friendly Learning Management System which is integrated with the university's student record system, meaning that every module is automatically given its own space on the platform, with student access being provided to these spaces based on the most up-todate enrollment data.

Canvas allows you as a student to access course materials, complete assignments and other assessments, access grades and feedback and communicate with your lecturers and fellow students. Canvas can be used on your desktop or laptop or by using the Canvas App on your smartphone or tablet. The Canvas App lets you keep track of course work and get up-to-date information on your modules and activities through push notifications.

Zoom

Zoom, where used, will allow you to participate in live online classes and other live learning events. The Zoom system is fully integrated into the Canvas Learning Management System, meaning you can access Zoom from inside Canvas itself. If Zoom recordings are made, these will also be accessible from inside Canvas. Zoom provides a wide range of features to support your learning including video conferencing, breakout sessions, desktop sharing, chat, and polling. There is also a Zoom app available for Android and iOS.

Ouriginal

Ouriginal is a plagiarism detection system which uses text-matching and writing style analysis to assess the originality of submitted texts. Like Zoom, the system is integrated into Canvas and, if used by your lecturer, will appear as an added feature to any Canvas assignment submissions they ask you to make. In some cases, lecturers may also provide you with Ouriginal analysis reports to help you to learn more about how academic writing and referencing works.

COUNSELLING

During your time at MTU Cork, you may experience personal and emotional issues that impact on your college experience. The student counselling service is here to support you to manage and overcome these issues and make the most of your time at MTU Cork.

The Student Counselling Service is a confidential service available to all fulltime MTU Cork students at no cost. It is staffed by professional counsellors who are experienced in working with students in a safe, non-judgmental and supportive way.

Counselling is offered on a one-to-one basis. When you contact the service, an initial session will be arranged for you to meet a counsellor and decide the best way forward for you. If counselling is deemed suitable, then the service provides an initial six sessions. Towards the end of these six sessions, you and your counsellor will review and, if necessary, discuss further possible options. MEDICAL CENTRE

The Medical Centre is situated on the Bishopstown Campus. It is available to all registered full-time MTU students including those in the MTU Cork School of Music, the MTU Crawford College of Art & Design and the National Maritime College of Ireland. We are open to students during term time and provide a comprehensive range of services suitable for student's needs.

What the Medical Centre provides:

- Medical attention to all registered full-time students.
- Appointments with Doctors and Nurses can be arranged by phone only. Please do not present to the Medical Centre without an appointment.
- Specialist clinics including Asthma, Sexual Health, Sports Injury and Vaccination.
- A fee of €10.00 applies for all Doctor consultations including Telephone consultations. Payment can be made by debit/ visa card over the phone. There is no charge if you have a Medical Card.
- Students in MTU Cork School of Music and MTU Crawford College of Art & Design have the opportunity to avail of the Grand Parade Medical Practice in the City Centre. Fee of €10 for doctor consultation. Tel: 021 2355784 for appointment. Student ID card must be presented at attendance.
- After hours, SouthDoc provides a Family Doctor Service. Tel: 1850 335 999. This service operates at night and weekends. Students who do not have a medical card have to pay the appropriate fee for this service.
- MTU is offering students in the NMCI the opportunity to avail of the Bridge Medical Practice, Carrigaline Primary Care Centre, Carrigaline, Co. Cork on 021 4372663 for the same fee structure as the MTU Medical Centre. Note: Students must ring and make an appointment in advance. Students must indicate, when they ring that they are an NMCI student. Students must produce their official MTU Student Card on arrival.

Student Assistance Fund

The Student Assistance Fund (SAF) provides financial support to students who are experiencing short or long-term financial difficulties while attending higher education.

What can I use it for?

The SAF is available to assist students with costs such as:

- Books and other class materials
- Rent, heating and lighting bills
- Food
- Essential travel
- In the case of student parents, childcare costs
- Medical costs

What costs are not covered?

Tuition fees, registration fees, student loan repayments or any costs borne by your university are not covered by SAF.

The Student Assistance Fund and the Fund for Students with Disabilities is co-funded by the Irish Government, the European Social Fund and the YEI as part of the ESF Programme for Employability, Inclusion and Learning 2014-2020.

Government Laptop Loan Scheme

Funding has been allocated to MTU under this scheme. Applications can be made through the University's Student Assistance Fund. FEES & GRANTS

Student Contribution Charge: €3.000

This is an annual charge set by the Government for all full-time third level students. Students can apply to Student Universal Support Ireland (SUSI) for a grant. For information on Grants go to www. susi.ie.

Union of Students of Ireland (USI) Levy: €7

This Levy is not covered by a SUSI grant and must be paid before the start of Semester 1.

If you have applied for a grant and are awaiting approval, you can apply to pay your fees in monthly instalments. Simply click www.mycit. ie/susi, complete the form including your SUSI Reference Number and submit it as soon as possible. Please read the terms and conditions before submitting the form. If your grant application is successful then any payments made will be refunded on the grant awarded.

Payment of Fees:

- Students are notified of their fees by e-mail to their MTU student e-mail account, therefore it is important that students check their e-mail accounts regularly
- To make payments, students should log on to the online payments facility www.cit.ie/pay. You will need vour student ID number (R000XXXXX), Date of birth and your Debit/Credit card details
- A receipt will be sent to your MTU email address
